# **COUNTRY PROFILES**



## **Summary Note**

This note briefly presents a series of profiles for several IATI partner countries produced in early 2017 by the IATI Secretariat with support from UNDP. It should be read in conjunction with each of the profiles.

#### **Background**

The 2030 Agenda confirmed the importance of transparency and accountability as a key principle towards the effective implementation of Sustainable Development Goals. This intent is fully contained in the IATI vision and mission statements adopted in July 2016. Most recently in December 2016, participants in the Nairobi High Level Meeting (HLM2) on Effective Development Cooperation specifically committed to "improve publication of open data on development co-operation, and support the use of this data by all relevant stakeholders"1.

At country level, IATI enhances current efforts made by partner countries to collect information on aid flows from donors and other providers that is timely, comparable and accessible to all. By joining the IATI, member countries commit to "a) Share and promote the vision and mission of IATI; b) Commit to using IATI data to the greatest extent possible..."2.

As the volume and quality of IATI data continues to expand, it is essential to understand better how country users that are committed to IATI can take maximum advantage of this standardized and real-time source of information. It was thus decided to implement a survey with active national IATI focal points of the 27 country partners, and to incorporate the main findings into an IATI focused-profile for each country, with analysis leading to some suggestions to each country to maximise use of IATI data.

#### The Survey

IATI government country focal points were asked to fill out a 27-question online survey in February 2017 to directly gather data for the profile of each country. The questionnaire was structured around four main areas: 1) management of development cooperation information, 2) recording of international development finance, 3) import of IATI data into local AIMS, and 4) using AIMS data in the budget cycle. Subsequent written and verbal exchanges with selected country-based respondents were carried out, as needed. Out of the 27 IATI partner countries as of March 2017, 14 (plus Somalia) provided replies to the questionnaire3.

#### The Profile

The IATI two-page country profiles summarize the situation of each partner country about their IATI commitments from the time the country joined the initiative and the current level of integration of IATI standards and data within the national systems. It provides survey findings on the extent to which each country makes use of IATI published data, the main challenges encountered, and provides some suggestions for increasing use of IATI data. General aid-related information, poverty levels and resources in the country, put these results into context and each profile is further enriched with IATI data extracted from the country's website (all data and values used in the profiles date from March and April 2017, and lists of the acronyms and of IATI countries' websites used are annexed below).
